









SET QUAINTLY AGAINST A field of grapevines in the heart of St. Helena is a perfectly posh vacation pad owned by Jay Jeffers and Michael Purdy. No strangers to design, the couple finished a complete redesign of their home with the addition of a pool, a much-needed accessory for Napa's sweltering summers. Built by Trainor Builders, the pool was designed in conjunction with landscape designer Katherine Webster, who seamlessly integrated both the necessary structural elements and surrounding vegetation. The most important feature: a Baja Shelf that allows for prolonged lounging. The addition of the shelf was inspired by one of their favorite hotels, the La Casa Que Canta in Zihuatanejo, Mexico, which has an infinity-edge pool with a shallow Baja Shelf facing the ocean where "we literally sit and read for hours" says Jeffers. A bench with a mount for a large umbrella was also incorporated to provide shade for the extended hours of enjoyment; you will often find the couple and their friends there, sipping boulevardiers. "It is a social pool, where everyone hangs out. It's not for laps," says Purdy. - Lindsey Shook
